

Effective January 1, 2010, the Utah Driver License Division began issuing a new card type; limited-term license, limited-term CDL and limited-term identification card. The new limited-term card will be issued to an individual who is not a U.S Citizen, National, or Permanent Resident Alien but have documentation showing they are in the country legally. This certificate will be valid for their approved length of stay in the country or five years, whichever is shorter or one year if no ending date exists. The division also changed the look of the Temporary Permit for all driving certificates and ID cards.

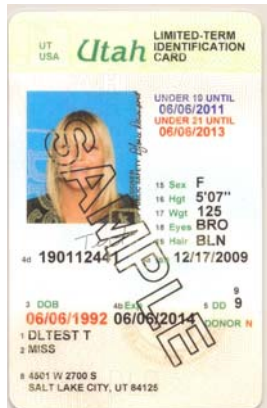
The regular document and limited-term document will appear very similar in style. However, the limited-term document will be identified by the heading "Limited-Term". Unlike the Driving Privilege Card (DPC), the limited-term document can be accepted as identification.

With this change, the Driver License Division will now issue three types of certificates and the Temporary Permit:

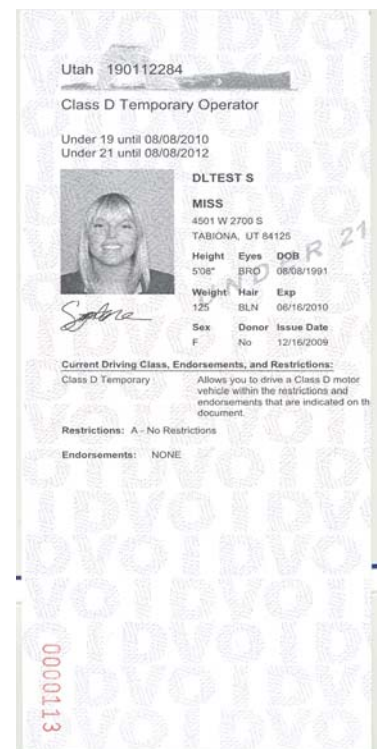

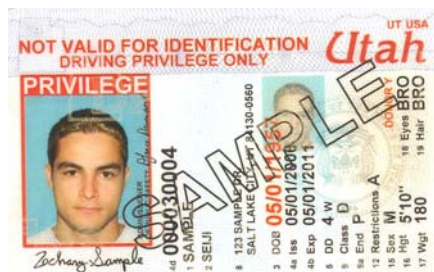
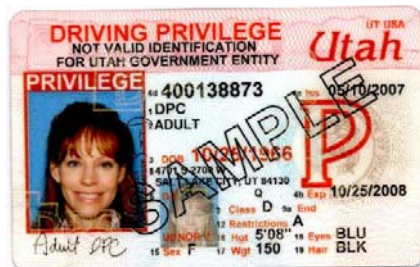
Limited-Term
