


# STATE OF UTAH SITUATION REPORT

# **Significant State Activity**

*New* Starting today, June 12, 2023, the State flood response will begin to be scaled back and transition to the recovery phase. To better match response activities, this report will move to a Monday, Wednesday, and Friday distribution schedule starting today.

#### **Immediate Concerns**

• Active River flood watches, warnings, and advisories have ended across Utah and southwest Wyoming. However, area rivers continue to run high, fast, and cold. [NWS SLC]

# **Current State (SERT) Actions**

Active Activated Emergency Support Functions: ESF #1, ESF #3, ESF #5, ESF #7, ESF #11, ESF #13, ESF #14, ESF #15, ESF #16, Logistics, VDCT, Volunteer Agency Liaison (VAL), Finance, and Air Operations.

## **Current Operational Requests**

• Active 8 active requests are in progress regarding various flood response and mitigation resources. 82 requests have been closed. [WebEOC]

#### Salt Lake County

• Active SR-190 and SR-210 are being monitored and assessed daily to determine if/when road closures are needed for land/mudslides, avalanches, or other hazards. Closures are possible at any time. [UDOT Cottonwood Canyons]

#### **Utah County**

• Active A section of Nebo Loop Scenic Road in Payson Canyon has been washed out and will be closed until further notice. The County has been assessing and tracking the damages. Spanish Fork Ranger District North Nebo FR015 and South Nebo FR015 roads are closed to all uses until July 31 or until damage to the road can be repaired.
